

Stormzy's Flat Stormed

Grime sensation Michael Omari, better known to his stage name Stormzy, was awoken at his residence in West Brompton, Chelsea on Valentine's Day this year during the early hours of the morning only to find his front door being kicked down by the Metropolitan Police. This is because he was wrongly accused of plotting to burgle his own flat.

Omari, 23, is well-known for his two major hits, 'Big for your Boots' and 'Shut Up'; both reached Top 10 in the charts. But he made national news recently when his neighbour called the 'feds' and reported him for supposedly planning to burgle his own home. They kicked down the front door to his flat in Chelsea, which he had recently moved into.

The rapper released an image of the debris on Twitter (@Stormzy1) with a little dig at the police when he wrote; "Woke up to Feds destroying my front door coz apparently I'm a burglar who burgles his own home. @MetPoliceuk need your bank details still."

The millionaire rapper's birthplace has very low housing prices compared to his new residence in Chelsea. The rates have an average distance of £1,700,307.

The met police said they stayed with Omari, who has been rapping since he was eleven years old, until 'it was secure'. The rapper has previously won best Grime act at the 2014 and 2015 MOBO awards. Michael was a handful of trouble in his early years of education as he got excluded several times in year 8 and was expelled from Sixth Form, surprisingly, he did achieve six A* GCSEs!
